- The St Paul Diocese is pleased to annouce that Msgr. Gary Franken from Vancouver has been appointed to become the new bishop for our diocese.
- Thanks to Shanlyn Cunningham and others we have a new communication plan. This was shared with Division leaders. Some points achieved from previous plan-
 - More than 20 professional videos were created where students, staff and family members shared their "why" for choosing GSACRD.
 - A French Immersion focus group was established with engaged members to help support marketing efforts for our programming.
 - A photo library was uilt so all advertising and schools can use professional photos of GSACRD students and staff.
 - GSACRD received monthly coverage on positive initiatives, not to mention several stories that made National and International news.
 - Increase in "followers" on all social media channels, including Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn, YouTube and Tik Tok.
 - 60+ ads were placed in various madians (T8N Magazine, Landmark Cinemas, social media, billboards, earned media, radio, print, blogs and more.

- Trustee Radford: That the Board of Trustees direct the administration to arrange to address traffic safety in Morinville with all parties concerned.
- The Town has on its books a motion to arrange a meeting with School boards, Ministers Panda and Nally. Also, a notive of motion for their October 11th meeting.
- That council directs the Mayos to invite both local school boards and Ministers Panda and Nally
 to a meeting to discuss the ongoing concerns, responsibilities and solutions for WHY 642 and
 advance the imperative to resolve the issues, creating safe passage for all.
- For (7): S. Boersma, R. White, J. Anheliger, R.Blanko, S.Dafoe, S. Richardson, and M.St. Denis
- Coucillor S.Dafoe provided notice that at the October 11, 2022, Regular Meeting of Coucil, he will move: "That Coucil directs the Mayor to reach out to Alberta Transportation with a proposal to install signalization at the intersection of 100 Avenue and Grandin Drive on a cost-sharing basis, with Morinville's share to be paid from available reserves (e.g. Safety Reserve)."

- Transportation, regarding students being late at Notre Dame, some bus roots have been doubled up to try and make up for the bus driver shortage. More supervision is needed at SKT.
