## Reports:

Teacher Report: Ms. B Roulston

We went throught the results of the Parent Division Assurance Survey
Results are as follows:
Celebrations
$78.3 \%$ of parents agree that their children have opportunities (e.g. options, extracurricular, online learning) that support engagement in school. This is up from last year by $10.4 \%$. $16.2 \%$ answered "don't know"
$95 \%$ of parents agree that their children have opportunities to participate in activities that teach about First Nations, Métis, and Inuit culture and traditions to further reconciliation. This is $7.6 \%$ above the division. ${ }^{* *}$ New this year. $2.5 \%$ said "I don't know"
82.3\% of our parents report they are satisfied with the variety of courses available to their children. This is an increase of $8.3 \%$ from last year. $11.8 \%$ of parents answered "I don't know"
$85.3 \%$ of parents report that they are satisfied with the opportunities their children have to participate in Physical Education. This is up by $11.3 \%$ from last year. $11.8 \%$ answered "। don't know"
$75.8 \%$ of parents agree that their child can access programs and services at school to get help with school work. This is up 18.1\% from last year. $21.2 \%$ replied "I don't know".
78.8\% of parents agree that their child can get help at school with problems not related to school work. This is up $17.3 \%$ from last year. $21.2 \%$ replied "I don't know".
72.7\% of parents report that they are satisfied that their children can access services (beyond regular instruction) that help students read and write. This is up by $11.2 \%$ from last year and above the division average by $14.7 \%$. $24.2 \%$ of parents answered "I don't
know"
$97 \%$ of parents believe that teachers care about their children. Up by $1 \%$ from last year.
90.9\% of parents report that their children are treated fairly by adults at school. Up by $14.0 \%$ from last year. $1.6 \%$ higher than the division.
$96.9 \%$ of parents agree that their children are safe at school.This is up by $1 \%$ from last year. 1.9\% higher than the division.
84.8\% of parents are satisfied with the opportunity to be involved in decisions about their children's school. This is up by $18.2 \%$ from last year. $0.7 \%$ higher than the division average.
$97 \%$ of parents report that they are confident that SKTA is a good school.This is up by $5 \%$ from last year. $3.9 \%$ higher than the division average

Areas to Focus on:
$77.5 \%$ of parents agree that teachers share their faith and the role of God in their life.*New this year. This is above the division by $1.8 \%$. $2.5 \%$ of parents disagreed. $20 \%$ of parents answered "I don't know"
$75 \%$ of parents agree that their children's religion classes help them to understand how faith can guide the way they live their life *New this year. This is below the division by $4.2 \%$. $5 \%$ of parents disagreed. $20 \%$ of parents answered "I don't know"
$77.5 \%$ of parents agree that in their children's school, students live their faith through works of charity and service to those in need. *New this year. This is below the division by $5.3 \% .5 \%$ of parents disagreed. $17.5 \%$ of parents answered "I don't know"
$89.2 \%$ of parents agree that their child is encouraged to try their best. This is down by $11 \%$ from last year, $3.9 \%$ lower than the division. $10.8 \%$ said "I don't know"
$81.1 \%$ of parents agree that their child is learning what they need to know. This is down by 4.6\% from last year. 13.5\% disagree. 5.4\% answered "I don't know"
$51.5 \%$ of parents agree that their children are being taught how to use technologies and social media safely. This is down by $6.2 \%$ from last year. $39.4 \%$ of parents answered "I don't know"
