Teacher Report: Tia Caldaralo (Grade 1)

- Likes to do a soft start in the morning
 - o This includes students agenda then working with table bins
 - First student done with their agenda gets to choose the bin for the table
- The students have put together a calendar, each student got a date to color (individual paper). When their day comes up they can put it on the calendar
- Prayer table
- Growth chart
- Jessie tree, students open a flap each day
- Students made a winter scene with Ms. Miller
- Height chart all classes have one, good reminder of "growing in love"
- Flexible seating, students change spots each month

- o Some taller chairs, some rocking chairs, one stationary bike
- o The stationary bike has been well used.
- Students will request to use it, asking if now is a good time
- Great to use if the body needs to move to aid in maintaining focus during sitting activities
- o Allows a movement break without noise or too much distraction
- Builds independence and self-awareness
- Question: what are the hardest transition times
 - Early afternoon can be challenging, but having a bonus snack time or movement activity or outdoor time helps
 - Typically this is not noticed as much after November as students are settled in the routine
 - o Breaks are built in to the daily schedule, especially in the afternoon
 - Library
 - Music
 - Phys-ed
 - Lunch eating after lunch recess is much better, a good settling time
- Question: do all classrooms have a stationary bike
 - o No, only grade 1-3
 - o Would like to have one for each class, around \$1000 each
 - The bikes are hardy and lasting
