REPORTS

Teacher Report: Dakota Bodez (Grade 2 and Music Teacher)

- Music
 - Ms. Bodez is Royal Conservatory trained in piano, and is Orff trained
 - The students work on 1-2 songs per week
 - Once they are familiar with the song on one instrument they switch to a different instrument
 - Q: Any funding you may need?
 - A: more hand drums
 - Q: Will there be choir again?
 - A: not sure, may start after spring break
- Grade 2

- Literacy programming
 - Literacy groups had been on-going but has stopped in January
 - Now they are working on targeting decoding (phonics) and have rearranged the style of literacy groups
 - Not all students are in small groups, instead centers are used
 - Sight words
 - Independent learning
 - Groups as EA can help
 - Novel study – working on vocabulary and retelling (gr. 2 and 3) with fluent readers
 - Maintain a 1:8 ratio in groups
 - T-Series assessments are done 4 times per year (division standard is 3)
 - Age referenced across the province
 - Results are not directly shared with parents
 - The school works to use a scaffolding technique with many subjects
 - Same language used to explain concepts that build on each previous year
- Q: Any funding needed for Gr. 2 or literacy?
- A: clipboards or mini whiteboards
- Q: have you noticed any improved literacy since COVID?
- A: yes, at SKTA there is consistent improvement in skills grade to grade
- Q: Is literacy a specific subject or ongoing?
- A: literacy is in all subjects all year long. There is some cross over between other subjects too.

- Review of dress code
 - Safe and weather-appropriate clothing
 - No slang or gang symbols (anything offensive)
 - Wear only graphics that support good community
 - No wheely shoes!
 - If this is the student's only footwear, then the wheel must be removed while at school
 - Teachers and staff will use discretion when dealing with dress code issues
 - Mrs. Gagne will speak with the girls
 - Mr. O'Gorman will speak with the boys
 - Parents are informed if needed
- Bullying
 - Repeated behaviour that causes harm, fear, distress to another student or students
 - Always conscious that children are not the sum-total of their behaviours
 - Expectations are reviewed and co-created in each class (when possible)
 - GSACRD Voice provides support and tools
 - There is Target support if needed (Voice and Counsellor)
 - Parents are contacted with discretion
 - After an Issue there continues to be ongoing supervision and frequent checkins both with the student at fault and the afflicted student
 - Teachers typically are aware of incidents first and involve admin, parents are included as needed
 - Parents, if you have any concerns bring them to your child's teacher and/or contact Ryan or Sherri

NEW BUSINESS

- \$500 grant can be used for Workshops
 - Other councils have expressed interest in the mental health workshop, we may combine with them
 - Foundational workshops?
 - Deadline?
- Swimming lessons start April 18 for grade 2 (other grades?)
 - More Dad volunteers are needed (must have criminal record and vulnerable sector checks completed)
 - Lessons are from 10:15 – 11am, assistance is needed at beginning and end, not during.
